


Engaging all students in the human adventure

In 2021, we held the inaugural Humanities Week, where ASU humanities units, centers and institutes hosted special events to highlight the ways in which we explore the human adventure across time, culture and place. The weeklong calendar of both in-person and virtual events covered a broad range of humanities-related topics, including history, literature, culture, racial representation, social justice and climate change.

Building a community of belonging

By measuring our success not by whom we exclude, but rather whom we include and how they succeed, The College builds up a community that values, welcomes and amplifies unique perspectives. Through a number of new initiatives, Sun Devils are able to have important conversations and develop diversity-informed research, while learning how to thrive in today's interconnected world. Of the 5,000+ students pursuing a degree in the humanities, 42 percent are Pell Grant eligible and 31 percent are the first in their families to attend a university.
