Conducting research through diverse perspectives

Haunani Kãne, an assistant professor in the School of Geographical Sciences and Urban Planning, organized and led the first research team entirely composed of Native Hawaiians to conduct climate and sea-level rise research in Papahãnaumokuãkea. Her team of researchers traveled by sailboat — an important part of incorporating the team's ancestral history into their research.



Expanding access for all students

The Online Undergraduate Research Scholars program offers hands-on, experiential learning specifically for students enrolled through ASU Online. The program launched in the natural sciences division and will expand to the social sciences and humanities divisions in the coming semesters.



Center receives \$3.5M grant

The Arizona Center for Medieval and Renaissance Studies' ongoing RaceB4Race programming received a \$3.5 million grant from The Andrew W. Mellon Foundation to support premodern critical race scholarship through curricular development, academic mentorship and public humanities work.

Building a community of belonging

By measuring our success not by whom we exclude, but rather whom we include and how they succeed, The College builds up a community that values, welcomes and amplifies unique perspectives. Through a number of new initiatives, Sun Devils are able to have important conversations and develop diversity-informed research, while learning how to thrive in today's interconnected world. Of the 29,800+ students pursuing a degree in The College, 37 percent are Pell Grant eligible and 30 percent are the first in their families to attend a university.
