**ADVISEMENT:**

- § Students on probation or disqualified, students desiring to transfer into CLAS from other colleges within the University, and students needing evaluation of out-of-state transfer credits should contact the Office for Academic Programs, SS 111.

A total of 15 hours must be taken from both the University General Studies (SB) and College Graduation Social / Behavioral Sciences areas. A total of 6 upper-division hours must be taken in CLAS, Social/Behavioral Sciences

Remember that the University General Studies combined HU and SB requirements requires a minimum of six hours in one area and nine in the other for a total of 15. At least one course must be at the upper division level.
